#### **Teen Birth Rate**

In 2023, the birth rate for Hispanic teens was 1.4 times higher than white teens. This gap increased to 2 times higher in 2024.



#### **About teen birth in Ector County**


Among all US counties with a population above 100,000, Ector County has the third highest overall teen birth rate. Among large Texas Counties, Ector County has the second highest teen birth, behind only Potter County.


The Ector County teen birth rate decreased by 0.4% in 2024, and now is 89% higher than the Texas rate and 178% higher than the US rate.

Since 2007, the Ector County teen birth rate has decreased by 69%, a similar rate of decline as the state as a whole.

#### **Non-Health Social Factors**

Structural issues such as poverty and lack of access to health care can contribute to teen pregnancy rates.

## **Health Care Access**

In Ector County there are **23 HTW** providers and 4 FPP providers.

Healthy Texas Women (HTW) and the Family Planning Program (FPP) are statefunded programs that provide access to birth control, screening and treatment for STIs, screening for breast and cervical cancer, and other preventive health care for low income residents.

## Sexually Transmitted Infections


Though teen birth rates have declined in recent years, STIs are increasing among Texas youth. Some increase may be due to better screening, but data suggests actual rates are on the rise. A majority of new STI cases in Texas occur in youth aged 15-24. STI rates may not be accurate if people in a certain county are not able to access medical care to be screened for STIs.




