Factors such as access to health care, information, and economic opportunity can lead to disparities in teen birth rates.

Teen Birth Rate

	Collin	Texas
Hispanic	15.8	28.2
Black	8.4	22.3
White	2.6	11.7
Asian	--	1.5

In 2021, the Collin County birth rate for Hispanic teens was **6.1 times higher** than the rate for white teens.


Teen Birth Count

Total Teen Births (15-19) in Collin County, 2021: 220


Teen Birth Rate per 1,000 Teens Aged 15-19




Non-Health Social Factors

Sexually Transmitted Infections

Though teen pregnancy rates are declining, STIs are increasing among Texas youth. Some increase may be due to better screening, but data suggests actual rates are on the rise.
