Factors such as access to health care, information, and economic opportunity can lead to disparities in teen birth rates.


Teen Birth Rate

	Tarrant	Texas
Hispanic	25.8	27.9
Black	23.8	20.3
White	8	10.5
Asian	2.4	1.4

In 2022, the birth rate for Hispanic teens was 2.9 times higher than white teens. This gap increased to 3.2 times higher in 2023.

Teen Birth Rate per 1,000







Teen Birth Rate per 1,000 Teens Aged 15-19




Non-Health Social Factors

Structural issues such as poverty and lack of access to health care can contribute to teen pregnancy rates.

Sexually Transmitted Infections

Though teen birth rates have declined in recent years, STIs are increasing among Texas youth. Some increase may be due to better screening, but data suggests actual rates are on the rise. A majority of new STI cases in Texas occur in youth aged 15-24.

	Count of new youth cases, 2023	Change from 2019	% of county cases occurring in youth
Chlamydia	6,483	15%	59%
Gonorrhea	2,123	106%	48%
Syphilis	209	26%	14%
HIV	65	-17%	19%
